NATIONAL COUNCIL ON EDUCATION FOR THE CERAMIC ARTS (NCECA) ANNOUNCES EXHIBITIONS LINE-UP FOR 47TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE IN HOUSTON

HOUSTON, TEXAS - (January 17, 2013) - The National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts is hosting its 47th Annual Conference in Houston March 20-23, 2013 and as part of the programming, more than one hundred related exhibitions will be on view throughout the city at more than 70 different venues. Local residents, visitors from outside the region and the nearly 5,000 conference attendees will have the chance view the multitude of ceramic-related exhibitions and experience the transformative and continually evolving influences of one of our most ancient and pervasive art forms.

NCECA will work with two of Houston's well-established cultural organizations to host its sponsored exhibitions. From January 26 - May 5, 2013, the **Houston Center for Contemporary Craft** will host the **NCECA Biennial**. The NCECA Biennial is a premier international juried ceramics exhibition. Jurors for the 2013 Biennial are Namita Gupta Wiggers, Curator and Director of the Portland Center for Contemporary Crafts, and internationally exhibited artists Cristina Cordova and Richard Notkin. NCECA will produce a color catalog featuring jurors' statements and work by all participating artists.

NCECA's National Student Juried Exhibition will take place from February 15 - March 23, 2013 at the Perimeter Gallery of **The Glassell School of Art, The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston**. Jurors for the 2013 NCECA National Student Juried Exhibition are artists Kevin Snipes and Bonnie Seeman. The exhibition features work from full-time undergraduate, graduate and post-baccalaureate students from throughout the U.S.

The **Texas State K12 Juried Student Exhibition**, sponsored by ClayHouston, will be on view at the Houston Public Library – Central in downtown Houston at 500 McKinney from March 15 – April 12 during regular library hours (Monday – Friday from 9 am – 9 pm; Saturday from 9am – 6 pm and Sunday from 2 – 6 pm). Jurors for the exhibition include Nick DeVries, Professor of Fine Arts at the University of Houston-Clear Lake, Dennis Smith, Chair of Ceramics at the Southwest School of Art in San Antonio and James Watkins, Full Professor at Texas Tech University.

Other notable exhibitions include:

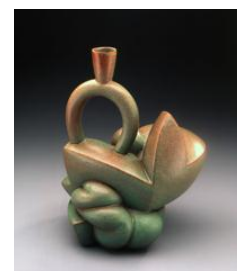

Ory Gallery of the Junior School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, located in the Administration Building runs March 19 – 23, 2013. The exhibition features works by Peter Beasecker, Sally Brodgen, Sam Chung, Steve Heinemann, Maren Kloppmann, James Lawton, Bodil Manz, Mark Pharis and Munemitsu Taguchi, accomplished figures in contemporary ceramics who share themes that bring renewed cultural currency to modernism, proving the movement to have persistent longevity.

Altered Earth curated by Roy Hanscomb at Lone Star College-North Harris will be on view February 26 - March 26, 2013. The exhibition includes utilitarian and sculptural vessel works by renowned artists Chris Gustin and Cynthia Bringle.

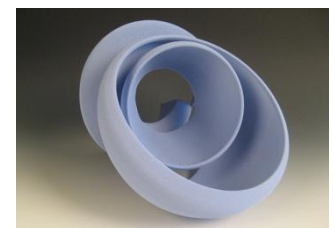
There are a number of international exhibitions being hosted throughout Houston as part of the NCECA 2013 conference, including:

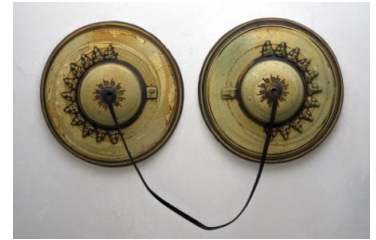
III. *Evolving Traditions: Ceramics from the Golden Bridge Pottery in India*

Additionally, there are a number of other conference-related events and programming that are free and open to the public, including Projects Space and the Gallery Expo. Projects Space will involve five different artists working individually or within teams to develop projects on site at the George R. Brown Convention Center that engage visitors in the creative process. The artists were selected this fall from an international pool of applicants. Projects Space is intended to act as a platform for experimental and innovative work that stretches the confines of the contemporary ceramic field. NCECA Gallery Expo brings an array of national galleries exhibiting some of the highest quality ceramic art into the heart of the annual conference. Galleries participating in the NCECA Gallery Expo, which will be held at the George R. Brown Convention Center, are able to interact with students, ceramic artists and members of the community interested in learning more about collecting contemporary ceramic art.
